

Sports Premium 2025-26 Spending Plan

Funding to support Primary PE and School Sport In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for physical education (PE) and sport. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision. Our school has been allocated £17840 for the academic year 2025-2026.

We will prioritise our PE and sport premium to improve in the following 5 key areas:

- 1: Increasing all staff's confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and sport
- 2: Increasing engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity and sport
- 3: Raising the profile of PE and sport across the school, to support whole school improvement
- 4: Offering a broader and more equal experience of a range of sports and physical activities to all pupils
- 5: Increase participation in competitive sport

To provide top up swimming lessons for Yr 4 and groups of pupils from Yr6 down who have not achieved the national expectation

Intended Impact 90%of pupils in Year6 achieve the national expectation for swimming. More pupils will enter the Catholic swimming gala and the Coventry swimming gala achieving a good competitive outcome. Increasing participation in competitive sport
