Safer Use of the Internet

To keep children safe:

- ensure that your child knows not to share personal information such as their passwords, phone number or email addresses.
- ensure that they only talk to real life friends or family if they are on sites with a social media element such as: Moshi Monsters, XBOX or Club Penguin.
- use privacy settings wherever they exist to keep their information private.
- be a good online friend and don't say nasty things even if it is intended as a joke.
- use secure and legal sites to download music and games.
- Do not open attachments unless you know the origin. Links to free items and quiz prizes should not be opened from unknown sources.
- Use Public Friendly WiFi when they're out and about to filter inappropriate content.
- tell them that they should never meet up with anyone they have met online without a trusted adult being present.
- remind children that they should seek the advice of an adult if they feel unsafe about their online experiences.
