Owls Club are now also offering after school sessions as follows:

Tax-Free Childcare

SJV Owls Club is signed up to the Government Tax Free Childcare scheme so if your child attend Owls Club, and you have not already done so please check the website to see if you are eligible to help with your fees. If you are eligible for Tax-Free Childcare, you'll need to set up an online childcare account for your child. For every £8.00 you pay into this account, the government will pay £2.00 to use to pay for your provider (SJV Owls).

You can use it to pay for Owls Club but it can't be used for school meals, trips, uniform etc.

Tips for Encouraging Open Discussions about

The online world is an entirely familiar and commonplace part of life for today's children and young people, far more so than far previous generations. There are many positives to children being able to access online materials, so it's important not to demonise the internet, games and apps, and limit the benefit of their positive aspects. At the same time, we do have a responsibility to educate children about the hazards they may encounter online (just as we would about real-world dangers) so it's essential that we don't shy away from talking to them about the complex – and often sensitive – subject of what they do and what they see when they're online.

Here are some suggestions for kicking off conversations with your child about their digital life ...

MAKE YOUR INTEREST CLEAR

howing enthusiasm when you broach he subject signals to your child that ou're keen to learn about the positives of their online world. Most children enjoy ducating adults and will happily chat bout what they use the internet for, or what games and apps they're into and ow these work. Asking to see their avourite games and apps in action could elp you spot any aspects that may need our attention — such as chat functions which might require a settings adjustment to limit contact with strangers. Keep stening even if your child pauses for a ong time: they could be considering how a phrose something specific, or they may be gauging your reaction.

BE OPEN AND HONEST, APPROPRIATE TO THEIR AGE
