



# Schools' Building Programme Update

## New Nursery at St John Vianney

The MAC are proposing to build a new Nursery at St John Vianney Catholic Primary School. Subject to planning permission the new nursery will be built adjacent to the existing school building providing a state-of-the-art area designed specifically for pre-school children.



The nursery will have capacity for 26 children made up of a combination of morning, afternoon, and all-day places, along with wraparound care before and after school hours, for children aged three and four.



## New Sports Hall at Bishop Ullathorne - opening in late 2022

Designs have now been approved for a wonderful new 4-court Sports Hall at Bishop Ullathorne Catholic School. The brand new £2.5m facility will open in late 2022 and will provide 600m<sup>2</sup> of sports space as well as changing rooms and storage/office space.



The new facility will provide a wonderful new space for all indoor sports from futsal to trampolining and will also enable whole school masses to be held.

## Cardinal Newman new canteen opens with brand new school on the horizon!

The new £4m canteen block at Cardinal Newman Catholic School opened in September. The wonderful new facility provides a 21<sup>st</sup> century dining experience over two floors.



Representatives from the school, HCCMAC Directors, Coventry City Council, the Diocese, the architects and the construction company were all present at the ribbon cutting event.

As we reported in the last newsletter we are delighted that Cardinal Newman Catholic School has been selected by the Government to be amongst the first 50 schools nationally to be rebuilt under the new school building programme.

A new £25m school is scheduled to open as early as September 2023. Whilst the final design is yet to be agreed we envisage exceptional new facilities replacing all the old 1960s and 1970s buildings.



## Holy Cross Catholic MAC Years 4 and 5 Flow Project

Holy Cross Catholic MAC primary schools were delighted to be invited to participate in the Coventry City of Culture 2021 Imagineer **FLOW Project – Future Life of our Ocean’s Wealth in the Autumn Term 2021**. The FLOW project has raised awareness about our local blue spaces as well as helping our young people understand the important role they have to play as future stewards of our planet.



In response to a performance day which started the project in September with the arrival of a ship on school playgrounds, and to a series of water safaris visiting local rivers and waterways, the pupils spent some time in the Imagineerium at the Daimler Powerhouse exploring creative ideas in order to develop their own performances aimed at engaging the wider community with ocean recovery.

The children were also given the challenge to dream up an art installation to be displayed at ‘Turning the Tide’ an Oceans Fair in April 2022. We had hoped

that all the children participating in the project would be able to gather together to share their performances but unfortunately due to Covid this wasn’t possible. Instead the children were all filmed and the link to the final film is: <https://youtu.be/hme67Yxmf7Y>

The children have really enjoyed participating in the project and the opportunity to work with a variety of artists. We are all looking forward to seeing the final pieces at the ‘Turning the Tide’ an Oceans Fair in April 2022. ## Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme

Well Done Erin, Cardinal Newman's own DoE Ambassador who had the following article published in The Telegraph recently. The article highlighted the benefits for pupils who have completed the DoE Award and how it helped them particularly through the challenges of the last two years and become more resilient.



*“During the pandemic, it got to the point where I didn’t want to get out of bed or take a shower or even feed myself. I thought “What is the point? I’m not doing anything so I might as well just stay tucked away.” Even when we could go out again, there was the anxiety of whether it was actually safe, whether I could pass Covid on to anybody that I love or have to lose anyone because of it. I was so down and I couldn’t sort myself out.*

*I was in the first year of those who didn’t do their GCSEs, didn’t get a prom or leavers’ ceremony or any of that. It was really hard. The other classes had home-schooling, but for our year group it was radio silence.*

*When I was at my lowest point, DofE started popping up, sending me emails giving advice, support and a place for community. I’ve been getting more involved: I’ve become a centenary ambassador for DofE; I’ve worked on our Youth Manifesto; I’m doing the COP26 social media takeover; I’m doing as much as possible.*

*Duke of Edinburgh really helped me with my confidence. Doing all this has brought me out of my shell and out of my comfort zone.*

*The resilience that DofE gives you, you take and you use everywhere. Right now I’m doing four A-levels and I plan to go to university and study to be a doctor, and if it wasn’t for the grit that DofE gave me, I wouldn’t be doing any of this.*

*It’s silly things: I get lost all the time and that was always a big cause of anxiety for me, but being out in the wilderness helped me. I learned it’s OK not to take a phone or track your location; you can just figure it out.*

*Prior to doing DofE I was quite a shy and reserved person. I started doing my bronze award at school with people who I’d been around but I wouldn’t have called them friends, but doing our awards together has created a bond for life. Once you’ve been through hell and got chased by cows together, it’s hard to let those people go.”*


imagined what the ocean would look like before, during and after pollution and created some beautiful collage pieces of art to display in our school. Through the art of movement, music and dance they

## Catholic Life, Collective Worship and Religious Education - Section 48 Inspection



This half term, St Thomas More welcomed two inspectors from the Diocese to complete their Section 48 inspection. The inspectors looked at the Catholic Life of the school, the provision for RE and the Collective Worship that takes place. The inspectors were very impressed with what they saw, with the pupils and staff making a very positive impression. Inspectors noted that 'pupils' behaviour is exemplary.

They are reverent and respectful in their attitudes and behaviours, and they are attentive during lessons. Pupils are highly supportive of each other,' and 'were very respectful when talking about those who hold different beliefs.' In RE 'a high percentage of pupils achieve work at or above diocesan expectations,' and Collective Worship is delivered in 'a high quality, enthusiastic and thought provoking' way enabling pupils to 'become more knowledgeable about their faith' with pupils reporting that 'prayer makes me feel happy, helps me to concentrate, stay focussed and joyful.'
