Maximum number in the group 30. Activities are open to all children in school from Nursery to Year 6


Monday 3:15 - 4:15 p.m. - **Lego Club** – play with Lego and use Lego interactive with the school computers



Please note: If you wish to apply to a Catholic school and your child is baptised Catholic <u>evidence of your child's baptism must be provided at the time of application</u> to the school office or to the Admissions Team. It is your responsibility to obtain and present this evidence.


