Class Texts: The children will study the following writing genres and features through our class texts: This is the Bear, Kipper's toybox, Knuffle Bunny and Major Glad, Major Dizzy.

At school, we will learn:



The children will study the following:

- identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations
- count to and across 100, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number
- given a number, identify one more and one less
- 2D and 3D shapes.

- Encourage your child to read daily, with opportunities to read to an adult and discuss the text with them.
- Enabling your child to learn their phonics words through reading and spelling
- Practise writing letters and words to develop their handwriting.



At home, you can help by: Encourage your child to use their number skills in everyday situations. Ask them to count, add and subtract in fun ways.

Practise number bonds to 10 and 20. Count in jumps of 2, 3, 5 and 10!

You could: - Find the odd and even numbers on your street .

Split amounts into parts and wholes

- Share sweets into equal groups
- Count coloured cars on the road Encourage your child to use their mental calculations.

Encourage your child to look at the shape of real world objects and use the correct mathematical terms to describe them.

The children will find out about:

- During this unit children will develop an appreciation of themselves and the world around them as part of God's creation. It also helps the children to reflect on the need to thank and praise God for his many gifts.
