


I hope that all of you have a very Happy and Holy Easter and take time to rest and we look forward to welcoming you back in the Summer Term.

Bishop Ullathorne Sports Hall


The Bishop Ullathorne Sports Hall is taking shape and on target for an August opening. The brand new facility will house 4 badminton courts, indoor football, crickets nets, basketball hoops, trampolining and mats for gymnastics.

The new changing areas will be complimented with accessible provision and an official's changing areas for tournaments.




