### Department for Education National School Rebuilding Programme

#### Holy Cross Catholic MAC School Rebuilds

We are very excited that our two secondary schools are included in the new National School Rebuilding Programme. This exciting news means that Holy Cross Catholic MAC is one of only a handful of educational trusts in the country receiving more than one secondary school rebuild. Bishop Ullathorne has started its planning and Cardinal Newman is about to start work.



BAM has been appointed as the successful contractor for Cardinal Newman Catholic School. Formal planning consent has been applied for and work is expected to start in April 2024, with the finished school opening in 2026/27.

The design includes a new two-storey academic block and a Sports Hall/Sixth Form block that will perfectly complement the retained dining block.





### **Capital Works Update**

#### **Energy efficiency works**

Over last summer, we completed a vast amount of work to improve our energy efficiency across our estate, including replacing old lighting with new, more costefficient LED lighting. This will improve lighting in areas around schools and also help with keeping school running costs down.



Associated works have been completed on expanding the canteen area to give students more indoor seating during social times.

This has been achieved by removing the old sixth form space and turning this into extra dining while creating a new area for sixth form, including a new social space with a separate study area.

#### **Bishop Ullathorne**

The Bishop Ullathorne new £4m Sports Hall is now open and has been nominated for the National Building Awards.

This brand-new facility houses four badminton courts, indoor football, cricket nets, basketball hoops, trampolining and mats for gymnastics.

Reception pupils are enjoying their new play area, this soft play grass and track is giving them a run for their money! We have also refurbished the courtyard at Scots Lane to create a usable play and study space for pupils.


