



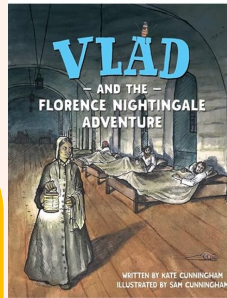
Hospitals and Healthcare

Mathematics



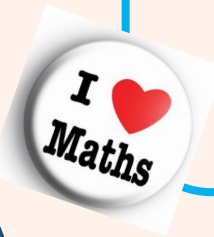
The children will study the following:

- making and identifying equal groups;
- using the multiplication sign, the division sign and equals sign in number sentences;
- Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the ten times table;
- Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the two times table;
- Solve problems involving multiplication and division facts;
- Length and Height including measuring in cm and metres; comparing and ordering length and height.

- encouraging your child to read daily, with opportunities to read to an adult and discuss the text often;
- enabling your child to practise their writing to develop letter formation and joined handwriting;
- share all kinds of books at home;
- reminding your child to use punctuation in their written sentences including: capital letters for the beginning of sentences and proper nouns; full stops; question marks and exclamation marks.

At home, you can help by:

- supporting your child with the homework tasks set.
- Encouraging your child to show their methods when completing problem solving tasks.
- encouraging your child to practise their times tables facts and to respond quickly to mental maths questions.

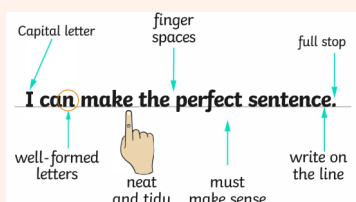

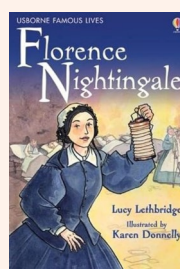

- understand something of the words and actions of Jesus at the Last Supper and reflect on his suffering and death.



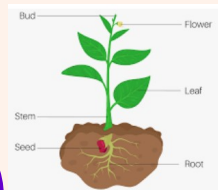

Science

This half term the children will study 'Plants'

The children will find out about:

- what plants need to grow;
- What is inside a seed;
- the life cycle of a plant;
- what plants need to stay healthy;
- how plants grown in hot, dry or cold places.



- planting seeds and looking after growing plants;
- creating a growing area in the garden or on a windowsill;
- talking about what plants need to stay healthy;
- Measuring the growth in plants regularly and comparing this with previous measurements.

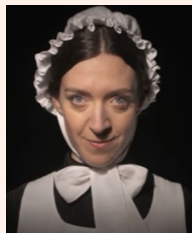
Humanities

As part of their study of Health and Healthcare the children will answer the following questions:

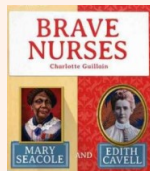
- 1) How can we find out about healthcare in the past?

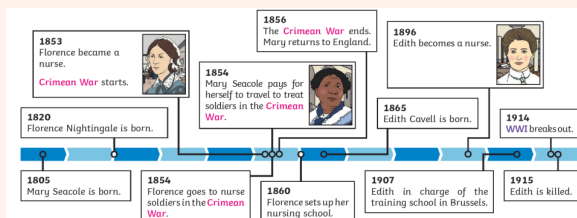

Arts

The children will study the work of Michael Parchment this half term—a Jamaican artist, sculptor and poet, who made colourful paintings using bright enamel colours with strong black outlines. He applied plywood to his paintings in his later years to create a 3D effect. His painting technique is unique—watercolour on crushed paper. The children will use a range of skills to make their art including:

- Using different kinds of materials to create collage work;
- Use repeated pattern to create collage;
- Working as an individual or within a group to create collage work.



- encouraging your child to create collage work using a range of media.
- finding out about a range of artists who use collage to create their art work.
- encouraging your child to keep a sketch book, in which they keep notes, drawings and images to represent their ideas for art work.
