The children will study the following: Place value of numbers to ten million

Rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100, 1000, 10000 and 100000

Addition and subtraction of large numbers using written methods

Rapid recall of multiplication facts to 12x12

Identifying prime numbers and factors of numbers

Investigation of factors of numbers and prime numbers



- encouraging your child to read daily, with opportunities to read to an adult and discuss the text often.
- ensuring that your child completes their spelling lessons weekly to improve knowledge and use of written and oral vocabulary.

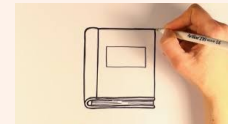
Arts
